MOBILE HEALTHCARE SERVICES REQUIREMENTS TO CONDUCT CAMP

The Ophthalmic Technologist (OT), and Audio Technologist should be ideally from the regional hospital or city close to the camp, in order to provide a better follow up and referral facility to patients.

The MOH (Medical Officer of Health) or RDHS (Regional Director Health Service) of the area can be a good point of contact to obtain nursing staff and a Medical Office (MO) serving in the area so that the language and other social barriers will be minimized. In certain areas, the PHI also assists in the camp operations and registry functions, for follow up action.

MOBILE HEALTHCARE SERVICES REQUIREMENTS TO CONDUCT CAMP

In addition to the above you would require the assistance of the mid wife / MO, nursing staff (6 nos) plus some extra persons to register, crowd / que manage (4), provide refreshments etc.. You can also obtain assistance from the local group such as Military, NGOs, Associations, Estate, Factory office, Local Authorities, Hospital Staff etc.. who will be able to communicate and manage matters easily.

Kindly also budget for suitable refreshments, especially if you request patients to come for a FBS (Fasting blood sugar) test where at least a bun and a packet of milk should be provided once they obtain the diabetes test after fasting for 12 hours.

MOBILE HEALTHCARE SERVICES REQUIREMENTS TO CONDUCT CAMP

Nursing staff and a Medical Officer from the area to conduct the above tests and provide advice and guidance to patients based on results with special advise on dangers of Alcohol, Smoking, Drugs, Sugar & Chewing Beetle should be also provided in most cases.

Also an awareness program about personal hygiene, nutrition, health and sanitation should also be done for the people in the waiting area by a qualified officer.

Persons to handle the registration, crowd / que management, provide assistance to the elderly / disabled and provide refreshments etc..

MOBILE HEALTHCARE SERVICES REQUIREMENTS TO CONDUCT CAMP

15 AMP 2 nos power connections required within 100 feet of the stationery bus at the camp to obtain power.

Additional patient waiting area, depending on the numbers, and also a registration table and tables to conduct the diabetes, Blood Pressure, BMI tests preferably indoors.

As the bus is 40 feet long, the access road to the camp site should be checked to ensure entry and exit, along with the ease of access for patients.



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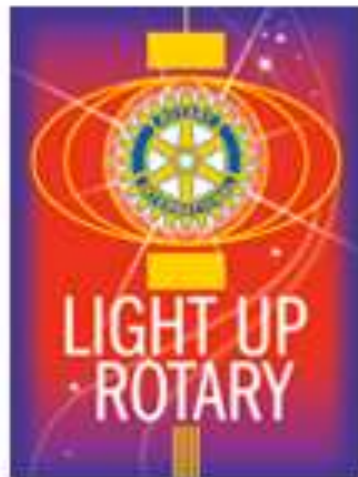
